- ▶ **Title**

- ▶ **Author/Contributor** In addition to author, contributors of all types—from editor to photographer—are noted.
- ▶ **Publication Date** The date that a particular format was published.
- ▶ **Publisher**

- ▶ **Item Status** (Active, out of print, etc.,) with the current publisher. The same title may have a different publication status with a different publisher or a different binding. The hardcover version may be out of print, but the paperback version is available.
